

The UP Resilience Institute Logo



When we talk about resilience, we usually refer to human capacity to go on with life. It is the capacity of humans to bounce back and continue to pursue their objectives. The logo design for the U.P. Resilience Institute is a symbol of this human trait.

The logo design is a graphic representation of **human cooperation and unity**. There are three graphic images that complete the processes and relationships that would operationalize resilience. These are the three major symbols arranged in an integrated manner. One symbol represents the academe (U.P. Resilience Institute), where researches both in the sciences and the humanities are conducted. These researches provide the vital knowledge about the forces of nature and human behavior. Another similar symbol represents the policy makers (government). This sector will be the major vehicle in delivering services that would link the academe and the people. The third symbol represents the people themselves whose cooperation and effort will bring success to the concept of resilience. The unification of these three sectors will complete the character of human resilience.



The UP Resilience Institute Artwork of Commitment

Entitled **Inang Kalikasan**, the artwork depicts Mother Nature who gives birth to all the harmonious and contradicting relations of all living and non-living things. These are involved in the cycle of life that without which, existence will not be possible. — the air we breathe; the limitless space through which birds spread their wings; the trees that provide homes and food for a variety of creatures and also protect us from soil erosion, floods, and other natural calamities; the soil which provides space for plants to grow and provides vibrant environment for insects and other animals; the sea that provides us with salt and other minerals; and the fish and other marine life which maintain the ecological balance and the cycle of life.

The artwork was produced through a relief printing process using **rubbercut** as a medium and hand painted acrylic colors.
